





Last Week



Last week was our first Practical Evening of the season. Instead of our usual system of utilising the knowledge of our experienced members to act as teachers, we asked Bob Moore a very experience photographer to be our mentor for the evening.

Bob began by saying that in his opinion we should make photography easy. He sets his camera to RAW capture, auto 'P' mode, ISO on auto, centre spot focus and selects a minimum shutter speed. He then lets the camera do the rest. He suggested that we should visit as many exhibitions as we can to see the work of others. Bob also recommended using as good a monitor as you can.

After the break Bob gave a demonstration of Topaz ReMask, a piece of software which enables accurate selections of difficult subjects. It certainly looked impressive. Bob then suggested that when sharpening an image, use the 'High Pass' method and not the more common 'Unsharp Mask'.

If any member requires help or advice on any aspect of photography please don't hesitate to ask. There will (nearly) always be someone who knows the answer. No question is too basic.



The 'Golden Hour' is from about 16.30 to 17.45, so I suggest we meet at 14.45 for a 15.00 start.

I suggest that members either wear wellies or waterproof boots as there is a small and hopefully shallow ford. Otherwise the paths are flat and good, and there are no stiles.

There is a big hide with views over a small lake, and at this time of year we would expect to see a good mix of birds including Swans, moorhens, different types of geese, cormorants, lapwings and different types of ducks.

A long lens would be useful but some of the birds may be relatively close so a medium zoom should be ok.

Afterwards we are going for food if anyone wants to the Radford Bank Inn, ST17 4PG which serves a decent carvery at very reasonable prices, plus other options.
