This Week - Guest Speaker - Chris Upton 'Thoresby..... The End of the Mine'

This week we have a very welcome return by Chris Upton. Chris is based in Nottinghamshire and specialises in Travel, Landscape and Social Documentary photography. Chris is an Associate of The Royal Photographic Society and an official Fujifilm X Series Photographer.

Thoresby Colliery, the last pit in Nottinghamshire, closed in July 2015 bringing to an end over 900 years of mining in the county. This presentation tells the story of how the project came about and how it was shot.
