Last Week - 'Annual General Meeting'

Last week we held our Annual General Meeting for 2019. As usual it went very smoothly and best of all quite quickly. Just a couple of items were voted on and approved by the members:

Club Membership Fees and Weekly Subscriptions. As from our new season beginning Monday 9th September 2019:
Yearly Subscription: Individual £25.00 : Member & Partner £40.00 : Family £50.00 : Weekly fee £2.50 : Guests £3.00

A small change has also been made to the scoring system with regard to the monthly competitions.

As is currently the method of scoring, each member can enter one or two images into each competition. If the member enters two images then the highest scoring image counts towards the league table. This will remain.

As from the start of the new season each image entered will also score one additional point. This is to encourage members to enter two images into each competition. Therefore if a member enters one image he/she will receive the judges score plus one point for entering. If a member enters two images he/she will receive the judges score for their highest scoring image plus two additional points, one for each image entered.

This is being implemented to help increase the number of images entered into monthly competitions as over the last season or two there has been a steady decline, and also to 'reward' those who do enter two images into each competition.

The committee were re-elected en-bloc with the following changes:

Brian Wheatley & Andrea Wheatley appointed onto the committee.

20th May - 6th Monthly Competition - PDI 'Creative'
